Providing spiritual support and a safe space to talk

No computer at home? Available Wednesday, Thursday and Friday 10am -2pm

### Crisis food:

Providing pantry support and access to fresh fruit and vegetables. Appointment only for details

### Advocacy:

Supporting you while making difficult telephone calls or appointments



## Women's support network:

A safe space to hear about women's support services in the area, to be supported through whatever challenges you are facing and spend time with an amazing group of female volunteers for a chat, laugh and craft. Thursdays 10am-2pm

### Clothing:

Pre-loved items for men and women, for those needing an outfit for a job interview, court appearance or casual clothing for everyday wear (coin donation)

Outreach Food Program: Support to local social housing in Camden by providing bread and bread products through the generosity of local businesses.

# Computer Training Program:

Currently running a 6 week basic computer training course. One hour lessons covering Microsoft Word, emails and internet. We are filling a gap for a large part of the community who have limited knowledge of technology and who need to use a computer to access information regarding Centrelink Benefits. Also beneficial for those who are a little rusty and need a refresher? Currently seeking a second trainer to cater for another 8 students.





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#### Volunteers:

15 volunteers who offer a minimum of 2 hours per week. Their roles are in administration, cleaning, cooking, community connecting, program co-ordination, prayer warriors plus being a huge support to Mike and me.
